The HCC Board of Trustees voted unanimously to name Margaret Ford Fisher, Ed.D., as its new chancellor.

"Dr. Ford Fisher's deep institutional knowledge, coupled with her forwardlooking vision and nationally recognized leadership, makes her the ideal leader to navigate HCC towards a future rich in educational excellence and innovation," said Dr. Cynthia Lenton-Gary, board chair.

Dr. Ford Fisher has dedicated four decades to serving HCC, most recently as interim chancellor from Sept. 2023-Jan. 2024. She was the founding president of HCC Online College and spent 20 years as president of HCC Northeast College.

"I am deeply honored for the opportunity to lead HCC and I thank the Board for the confidence it has placed in me," Dr. Ford Fisher said. "I am committed to a vision of providing a Real World Education for a Talent Strong Future and look forward to fostering a talent-strong Houston, enriching the lives of all of our students, while elevating our community."



## Trustees acknowledge and honor two new members, one re-elected member

HCC Trustees recently acknowledged and honored two new members and one re-elected member.

New to the board are Laolu Davies-Yemitan, who will represent District IV, and Sean Cheben, who will represent District V.

Davies-Yemitan is a commercial real estate broker and developer who serves as principal at Five Woods Realty. He earned a bachelor's degree in biotechnology with a minor in chemistry from the University of Houston-Downtown. He also earned an MBA in finance at UHD.

Cheben has held multiple roles in the energy business. He earned a bachelor's degree in chemical engineering from the Georgia Institute of Technology. He attended Clear Creek Independent School District schools through elementary, middle and high school.

In addition, Dr. Pretta VanDible Stallworth of District IX has been re-elected to serve a third term. She served as a board member from 1989-1993 and from 2017 until present.

She holds bachelor's and master's degrees in chemical engineering from Rice University as well as a bachelor's degree in chemistry from Texas Southern University. She also holds an MBA and a doctorate in Christian education.

The trustees serve as the governing body of the college system. It has nine members who are elected from single-member districts. Board members hold staggered six-year terms and serve without remuneration.

### HCC enrollment continues moving upward

Community colleges across Texas are seeing a post-pandemic recovery in enrollment.

The Texas Tribune reported that a total of 676,141 students were enrolled in community colleges this fall, a 4.25% increase in enrollment since 2021 when the COVID-19 pandemic hit.

HCC saw its own enrollment jump by 3% this past fall semester, while the spring semester saw an increase of 13%. Students are attracted

HCC's affordability, where degrees can be earned for lower tuition costs than four-year colleges.

"Our programs are valued, and students are seeing that we are offering a path to realworld education that can lead to meaningful careers," said Chancellor Dr. Ford Fisher. "The future looks bright for HCC, and our teams of counselors and financial aid specialists are ready to assist students get on board."

### HCC's VAST Academy recognized with Star Award

HCC received a 2023 Star Award from the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board for its exceptional contributions of its Vocational Advancement and Skill Training (VAST) Academy.

The VAST Academy provides post-secondary transition programs and support services that lead to meaningful credentials, employment and independence for individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities.

"The VAST Academy was a great experience for me," said Patrick Hill, a recent student who earned an associate degree in culinary arts. "It gave me the confidence to excel in my field and to further my education."

# HCC Online College is a convenient path to certificates, degrees

When HCC launched its online college, no one could have predicted its growth and success in providing pathways to students now thriving in careers.

Repeatedly named by Newsweek as one of the nation's Top 150 online colleges, HCC provides options for students too busy to attend on-campus classes.

"Our outstanding online classes deliver the same high-quality instruction as HCC's inperson classes," said Jerome Drain, Ph.D., interim HCC Online College president.

HCC offers 60 online and 70 hybrid online programs, including thousands of courses in more than 80 academic and workforce disciplines.

HCC's Office of Institutional Research indicates that students learn equally well in online classes when compared to students in traditional classes. Students can also apply for financial aid and receive counseling on which courses to take—conveniently all online.

What's more, HCC recently opened Digital Access Centers (DAC) across the system. DACs are spaces with access to technology where students, including online students, will have internet access, noise canceling headphones, a quiet place to think, write, taken an exam, or study with other students or meet an HCC tutor.



This work and other efforts led to HCC recently being named a member of the American Association of Colleges and Universities Institute on Digital Equity as a national leader in online education.

"We're helping people in the community have a place to learn the skills needed to become a part of the digital world something many have been unable to attain," Dr. Drain said.
